2. Perspective officers are required to job shadow at least one current officer for the desired position.
3. When you have decided to apply for a particular officer position, write a brief paragraph explaining:
  - ✓ Who you are and what position you're applying for.
  - ✓ Why you want to be a Psi Chi officer.
  - ✓ How you're qualified for the position.

4. Once chosen, the current officers will elect the officers for the following year. At that point, the perspective officer will be inducted as an officer during the Induction Ceremony at the end of the year.
